The Safety Inspector provides services to employers, workers, and the public related to industries identified within the Northwest Territories (NT) and Nunavut (NU) *Mine Health and Safety Acts, Explosives Use Act, Safety Acts* and the associated *Regulations*.

Through education, collaboration and enforcement the Safety Inspector assists stakeholders in achieving compliance with the *Acts & Regs* under the direction of the Chief Inspector/Safety Officer NT/NU.

This position requires a degree or diploma in science preferably mining or OHS, from an accredited university and a minimum of 5 years of experience in the mining/exploration industry. We consider the following an asset: demonstrated Occupational Health and Safety experience, OHS Certificate or diploma. A valid class 5 driver's license is also required. Equivalent combinations of education and experience will be considered.

The salary ranges from \$44.75 to \$53.44 hourly (approx. \$87,262.50 to \$104, 208 yearly), plus a Northern Allowance of \$3,450 yearly.

A satisfactory criminal records check is required for this position.
