The Communications Officer is part of an internal and external service delivery team that provides creative, professional and strategic communications and marketing advice to WSCC employees and Senior Management on the delivery of its programs and services throughout Nunavut and the Northwest Territories. This is accomplished through a variety of media, including social media, websites, newsletters, reports, print material, awareness campaigns, special events and trade shows, media releases, newspaper, radio, and television ads.

Located in Iqaluit and reporting to the Manager, Communications (based in Yellowknife), the incumbent assists in the development, coordination, and implementation of the WSCC Communications Strategy, and the production and promotion of communication messages and materials to reach their intended audiences. The Communications Officer ensures the quality and consistency of WSCC's brand identity and corporate image on all external facing materials and messaging.

This position assists in the development and delivery of the WSCC Communications work in support of the organization's Corporate and Strategic plans and incorporates Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit; a body of accumulated knowledge of the environment and the Inuit interrelationship with the elements, animals, people and family.

We require a Bachelor degree or diploma in communications or marketing, public relations, or a related area with two years of directly related experience in a related field. We consider equivalent combinations of education and experience on a case-by-case basis.

Salary ranges from \$46.52 to \$55.57 per hour (approximately \$90,714 to \$108,361.50 per year) plus a Northern Allowance of \$9.34 per hour (\$18,205 per year).

A satisfactory criminal record check is required for this position.
