Do you enjoy On the Job Training? Is Safety on the job and/or at home a passion of yours? Are you a Nunavut Beneficiary, who is able to communicate in Inuktitut and/or Inuinnaqtun? The Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission for the NWT and NU has what you are looking for!

Prevention Services division is seeking self-motivated and enthusiastic individuals to fill a Junior Safety Officer position. This position through on the job training and distance education assistance, will gain the knowledge and skills in areas related to occupational health and safety, and at the end of two years the candidate will meet the screening criteria for a Safety Officer position.

The Junior Safety Officer supports the administration and enforcement of the Northwest Territories and Nunavut Safety Acts and OHS Regulations and fosters the vision, mission and values of the Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission.

This is a training and development position, for bilingual speaking and writing candidates, in English and Inuktitut/Inuinnaqtun. Successful completion of the program will qualify the candidate to meet the screening criteria for a Safety Officer position. The development of Safety Officers who live and work in Nunavut and Northwest Territories will ensure that WSCC has qualified staff to fulfill its Vision, Mission and Values.

We require a Grade 12 diploma and a minimum of 3 years work experience. Trades certificate or mining experience would be an asset. Experience working with legislations or regulatory standards, is considered an asset. Candidates must have a strong interest to learn about occupational health and safety, including legislation, safety management systems (SMS), and internal responsibility systems (IRS). We will consider equivalent combinations of education and experience when determining progressive experience on a case by case basis.

Salary ranges from \$38.98 to \$46.54 hourly (\$76,011 to \$90,753 yearly), plus a yearly Northern Allowance of \$17,914.

A satisfactory criminal records check is required for this position.
