Workers' Compensation law says you are a Harvester if you:

 Hunt, fish, gather, or trap and most of your livelihood comes from this activity.

AND

 You live in the Northwest Territories and have a General Hunting Licence, or if you are a beneficiary under a land claims agreement.

OR

 You live in Nunavut and have a General Hunting Licence, or if you are a beneficiary under the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.

If I get hurt harvesting, what do I need to do?

- Go to the nursing station or hospital as soon as you get back to town.
- Tell the nurse or doctor you were hurt when you were hunting, fishing, gathering, or trapping.
- Go and see the Renewable Resource or Wildlife Officer in your community.

They will help you fill out a form called a *Harvester's Report of Incident*.

It is important to fill out this form as soon as you can.

What happens then?

- The Renewable Resource or Wildlife
 Officer will send the form to the Workers'
 Safety & Compensation Commission
 (WSCC).
- The WSCC will determine if you qualify for the program. You must generate at least 25% of your gross income, including \$7000 for country foods, from hunting, fishing, trapping, or gathering activities.
- The nurse or doctor will talk to the WSCC about your injury.
- The WSCC will consider if you qualify for benefits. Benefits may include money, medical treatment, and other services.
- You may receive benefits from the WSCC until you are well enough to go back to harvesting.
- If a harvester is killed while harvesting their family may get a pension. That means their family will get money every month from the WSCC. The WSCC will also help pay for a funeral.

What if I get hurt at home?

The WSCC only pays if you are hurt when you are harvesting, or on your way to and from harvesting.

What about my equipment?

The WSCC doesn't pay for any equipment like boats, guns or snowmobiles.
