

## Media Release Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission Announces New Workers' Advisor

**Yellowknife, NT (January 3, 2017)** – Today, the Workers' Safety and Compensation Commission (WSCC) welcomes the appointment of Mr. Patrick Scott of Yellowknife, Northwest Territories, as the new Worker's Advisor for the Northwest Territories & Nunavut.

Appointed by the Northwest Territories Minister Responsible for the WSCC, the Honourable Glen Abernethy, Mr. Scott begins his three-year term as an advocate for injured workers.

The Workers' Advisor acts independently and impartially from the WSCC, helping injured workers and their dependants through every step of the claims process, like:

- Getting information from the WSCC;
- Talking with the WSCC about the claim and trying to work out a solution to areas of disagreement;
- Explaining the WSCC process and decisions;
- Helping decide if more information is necessary to support their case;
- Reviewing file evidence;
- Helping prepare and present their case to all WSCC decision-making levels; and
- Helping to find other community services that might be of assistance.

"Beginning the claims process can appear intimidating," says Dave Grundy, WSCC President & CEO. "The Workers' Advisor is an important member of a claimant's team, and Mr. Scott will certainly be an asset."
