The WSCC's vision is to eliminate workplace diseases and injuries. In partnership with stakeholders, we promote workplace health and safety while providing no fault insurance to employers and care for injured workers. We uphold the values of respect, engagement, integrity, openness, cultural safety, excellence and stewardship in the workplace.

The WSCC has the legislated responsibility to ensure the proper stewardship of the Workers' Protection Fund for the benefit of workers and employers. The WSCC understands its obligation to protect the integrity of the Fund by taking steps to ensure compliance and prevent offences against the Fund.

The Investigator is responsible for the development of a uniform and systematic process for detecting, deterring and dealing with fraud and abuse. The position assesses the WSCC's risk level, researches fraud prevention systems and prepares formal recommendations on how the WSCC should address fraud in the future.

The Investigator position is located in Yellowknife and reports to the Manager, Internal Audit and Investigations. Investigator conducts and coordinates entitlement and fraud investigations which might include surveillance. These investigations can be referred internally by other units within the organization or from externally (tips). Investigator also reviews Claims files to identify instances of non-compliance with the Workers' Compensation Act (WCA) and follows up on the identified issues. Investigator reviews Medical Suppliers payments to ensure their accuracy and validity and might do site audits.

The requirements for this position include a graduation from an accredited Police Academy or equivalent academic accreditation. In additional courses in interviewing skills and report writing and a minimum of five years of related law enforcement experience. A valid class 5 driver's license is also required.

Salary ranges from \$49.91 to \$59.61 hourly (approx. \$ 97,324.50 to \$ 116,239.50 yearly), plus a Northern Allowance of \$3,700 yearly.

A satisfactory criminal records check is required for this position.
