In partnership with stakeholders, we ensure workplace safety, and care for workers.

The Chief Occupational Health and Safety Inspector (Chief), Nunavut directly contributes to the WSCC's vision, mission and values by promoting education, awareness, compliance and enforcement of worker Health and Safety legislation for the NT. This position is dually appointed in both Nunavut (NU) and the Northwest Territories (NT) and is a legislated requirement; has specific legislative duties and authorities und the NU and NT Safety Acts, Mine Health & Safety Act, the Explosives Use Act and their associated Regulations.

The Chief provides leadership, direction and oversight of Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) programs and services in the NU and plays a key role in the implementation and development of the WSCC strategic priorities and objectives particularly those focusing on advancing the safety culture while delivering quality outcomes and services for NU.

We are looking for a flexible and innovative individual who has demonstrated and progressive experience in and OHS environment and progressively more senior and recent supervisory skills. This position require knowledge and understanding of regulatory enforcement, that includes experience with inspections, investigations and prosecutions. The successful applicant must have strong interpersonal and leadership skills that facilitate active participation as a contributing member of a cross-functional team.

An OHS degree or certification from a recognized institution and a Canadian Registered Safety Professional designation, OR a Degree in Engineering or Applied Science and a P. Eng. Professional designation, with a minimum 10 years of progressive related industrial and/or mining/exploration experience, and at least 5 years recent progressive management experience at a senior level.

The salary is \$61.04 to \$72.91 (\$119,028 to \$142,174.50 annually), plus an annual Northern Allowance of \$18,205.
